

# GEOLOGIC MAP OF THE HORSESHOE MOUNTAIN QUADRANGLE, SCOTT COUNTY, ARKANSAS

#### **Correlation of Map Units**




### **Descripton of Map Units**

Atoka Formation middle (Pennsylvanian) - The Formation consists of marine tan to gray silty sandstone and grayish-black shale. In the Arkansas Valley and frontal Ouachita Mountain provinces this formation is subdivided into the upper, middle, and lower members.

Atoka Formation lower (Pennsylvanian) - The lower Atoka is a sequence of marine, mostly tan to gray silty sandstones and grayish-black shales. Some rare calcareous beds and siliceous shales are known. The Atoka has the largest areal extent of any of the Paleozoic formations in the state.
